FACILITIES

The Diesel Truck Driver Training facilities (Administrative, Training offices, Classrooms, and Driving Range) are located at the Reese Center in Lubbock, TX. The facility utilizes a private range to operate the driving range and backing area training. The modern classroom and lab facilities are fully equipped with heating and air conditioning and are arranged specifically to suit the subjects taught. SPC maintains a fleet of specialized training vehicles equipped with student seating in place of sleeper berths. Road vehicles have blind side cameras and other monitors for training purposes. ATDS road tractors are all-manual, and pull loaded and unloaded trailers for training purposes.
